Project title: Expanding Recovery Support

Project description:

The *Example Drug Coalition* is seeking grant funding to expand a program focused on enhancing recovery support through the employment of an additional Certified Peer Recovery Specialist (CPRS). Our coalition successfully established and implemented a recovery support program by hiring our first CPRS in 2021. The existing CPRS has provided peer support services to 163 clients and their families within our community since their start date in 2021. The program and position has been extremely impactful within our community but there is still a need for additional support.

Our current CPRS is responsible for providing recovery support and resources to non-justice individuals and their families. However, given the intersectionality of the justice system and substance use, we see the need for a full-time CRPS that will work specifically with justice-involved individuals. Hiring this position would expand our recovery support program by offering support services to justice-involved individuals in recovery from mental health or substance use disorders.

CPRS play a crucial role in the field of mental health and substance use disorder recovery. According to multiple sources listed above, receiving support from CPRS demonstrates higher rates of successful recovery and improved overall well-being. Research has shown that peer support can significantly reduce the risk of relapse and enhance treatment outcomes. The lived experience of a CPRS, having navigated their recovery journey, fosters a unique connection with individuals seeking assistance, promoting trust and understanding.

This peer-driven approach has been associated with increased engagement in treatment programs, decreased hospitalization rates, and a sense of empowerment among those in recovery. The integration of certified peer recovery specialists into the criminal justice system aligns with the evidence-based notion that peer support is a valuable and effective component in the continuum of care for individuals facing mental health and substance use challenges.

Our program is designed to address the holistic well-being of our clients as they transition into sober living. Every client is unique, and our approach varies based on individual needs. Some may benefit from medical-assisted treatment and transitional living, while others may require intensive outpatient programs or simply recovery meetings. The CPRS will help make these assessments and connections. The funding we seek is crucial to help these individuals rebuild their lives, as many of our clients need to change their current environments to maintain sobriety and avoid the risk of overdose and death.

Example Drug Coalition will attempt to immediately hire a Certified Peer Recovery Specialist to begin training, and to support our justice-involved population. They will utilize voucher money to assist these individuals to begin their detox or continue their sobriety in whatever ways are necessary. They will also transport individuals and/or family members as necessary to get their processes started. Often, additional facilities and resources are located outside of our county, and reliable transportation is critical for successful recovery. Additionally, the CPRS will collaborate with multiple organizations, attend community and work-related meetings, and attend and/or facilitate trainings as needed.
